Mr. Harrell's military experience was with the 1st BN, 111th Artillery, 29th Division in Norfolk. He is now a "snowbird" and nesting in Venice, Florida and wants to attend our meetings while here. Our group raised a glass in honor to our loyal member and friend, Pastor Philip Bliss, who holds the "Lou Gehrig Award" for not missing a Post meeting! We are proud to shine the light on this loyal member of Florida West Post 2 who has done great things in the lives of those American soldiers fighting in Vietnam during his tour of duty there in 1968.

Pastor Bliss served with the 13th Aviation Battalion of the 1st Aviation Brigade, a helicopter unit located on a small airfield in Soc Trang, south of Saigon, below the Mekong River delta of South Vietnam. Once stationed, Pastor Bliss' mission was to transport members of the South Vietnamese army into an area of operation in heavy Huey aircraft, then at the end of their mission they were sent back in to pick them up. Pastor Bliss recalls thinking "what in the world am I doing here?", "will we get shot?". Knowing that God was with him, his anxiety melted away and he was able to focus on his duties.

Throughout his experiences in Vietnam he was also asked to help teach English to the resident Vietnamese, which he enjoyed doing, but felt that he was not making much of a difference, he said laughingly! We honored Pastor Phil for his loyalty and service to our Post and we hold him high for his past service to our men in uniform. Thank you Pastor Phil. We thank you Veterans all!
