<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: The veterans must have served in the Battle of Normandy (Jun 6, 1944 – Aug 30, 1944) and provide a copy of their military discharge papers, also officially known as DD Form 214 or DD214. All veterans receive this Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty once they are out of the military. In a nutshell, the DD214 is proof of your military service. All branches use this same form. Please submit inquiries directly to The Greatest GENERATIONS Foundation if you are interested.
